New Sidewalk on Moran Rd

Construction recently commenced on the west side of Moran Rd to install a new sidewalk. This area was devoid of pedestrian sidewalks and requests from residents led to this installation. This new sidewalk will ensure that pedestrians, especially the school children, will have a safer walking environment.

Sidewalk Reconstruction on Middlefield Rd

City crews are replacing the sidewalks on portions of Middlefield Rd. This work will give this area a fresh look and a safe walking environment for pedestrians.

4181 Sheppard Ave OMB Appeal

The proponents for 4181 Sheppard has submitted an appeal to the Ontario Municipal Board for permission to develop this land into residential townhouses, live/work units and a twin high-rise mixed use building. The OMB Case & File Number is PL150001.

Mandatory Downspout Disconnection

Ward 41 is part of the Phase 3 of City's Mandatory Downspout Disconnection with the deadline of December 3, 2016. Disconnecting the downspout reduces the amount of rainwater that enters the sewer system, which can help reduce the risk of basement flooding, allow the natural process of rainwater filtering through the earth. This will further help reducing the need to water our gardens and lawn and decrease the release of polluted rainwater runoff into local waterways. Road Closure on Markham Rd last weekend of August,

July Council Meeting Highlights

Toronto's 15-year Transit Plan Council adopted recommendations for moving ahead with key projects that will form Toronto's transit network by 2031 – including approval of additional technical and planning analysis of a SmartTrack concept with up to six new stations, a one-stop Scarborough Subway Extension, an Eglinton East LRT, an Eglinton West LRT extension and a Downtown Relief Line.

Plan to improve road Safety was endorsed by Council unanimously for a 5-year Road Safety Plan with the goal of reducing the number of road fatalities and serious injuries, especially for vulnerable road users.

Improving Community Safety was approved by Council to take steps to enable new initiatives that support community safety to proceed, including the use of provincial and federal funding, in response to incidences of violence this summer.

Long-term Strategy of Managing Waste was adopted by Council which includes the goal of working toward a circular economy and a zero-waste future that is measured by a "per capita" waste generation rate. Council endorsed a 70% target for residential waste diversion by 2026 among other actions and targets for waste management.
