Metrolinx Fall Agincourt Community Information Meeting. Please mark your calendars of the next Metrolinx Agincourt Corridor Community Information meeting to be held on Tuesday October 4th from 6:30-8:30pm at the Agincourt Community Recreation Centre at 31 Glen Watford Drive, just north of Sheppard Avenue. At this meeting Metrolinx will be providing neighbourhood residents with a status update on recent and ongoing developments surrounding the twin tracking project already underway along the Agincourt-Stouffville GO Corridor. Please note this meeting replaces the one previously scheduled for September 27. We look forward to seeing you there.

Toronto's Ward Boundary Review is seeking feedback from the public on two ward boundary options. A public meeting will be held in Scarborough on **Thursday, September 15**th, at Scarborough Civic Centre, Committee Room 7, from **7pm to 9pm**. Toronto Hydro begins Monthly billings this fall for residential and small commercial customers. Customers will now receive 12 bills per year instead of six, with each bill representing approximately 30 days of energy use. This will be phased in over the fall, beginning in September. This move was mandated by the Ontario Energy Board in 2015. This will help customers manage their electricity costs as it provides a more current view of their electricity habits that are impacting the bill. The Pre-Authorized Payment Plan (PAP) will also be transitioned to monthly billing.

Monthly Utility Billing Option, One Year Pilot Program is now offered by Revenue Services to property owners with the option to receive their utility bills on a monthly basis. Instead of three bills a year, homeowners who are eligible for the pilot will receive one bill per month, meaning smaller, more manageable payment amounts. Organic Fertilizer Application for all sports fields in Ward 41. Some background on the utilization of organic fertilizer – it is beneficial in that it develops the 3 main components of soil – physical, chemical and biological, and in so doing improves soil health, which in turn would grow healthier plants that are naturally more resistant to pest pressures. In addition, organic fertilizer provides water soluble plant nutrients that are slowly released into the soil which supports a more gradual and consistent rate of plant growth. It is also a source of valuable organic matter for the soil.

Arena Roof Replacement at Commander is scheduled to be replaced in spring of 2017 after the hockey season. This project has been brought forward to accommodate the installation of solar panels by the renewable energy office later in 2017.
