Get Ready for Winter – Winter Maintenance

During the winter season from November to April, City of Toronto, Transportation Services patrols and checks road conditions on an ongoing basis, as well as monitoring weather forecasts in order to take appropriate and timely response and action. Here is the gist on City of Toronto's winter maintenance.

As keeping streets clear of snow is a major challenge, safety of the pedestrians, cyclists and motorists is the main priority. During or after a snow storm, the operation crew will follow the following service levels:

- Prior to a snow storm, salt brine will be applied to hills and bridges to enable easier removal
 of the snow after the snow storm;
- Local roads and laneways are salted when snowfall begins;
- Snow plough follows the service levels outlined below:
 - 2cm of snow on expressways, sidewalks with high pedestrian volume and some bus routes where it is mechanically possible;
 - o 5cm of snow on main roads
 - o 8cm of snow on local roads, sidewalks with low pedestrian volume;
 - O Driveway windrows will be opened between 1 and 2 hours of the road being ploughed where feasible (with no street parking near the driveway where the windrow-opening machine would operate), after 8cm of snow has fallen. A width of about 3m will be opened, which is sufficient space for one car. Windrow snow clearing is not provided on narrow streets with no boulevards or where on-street parking is permitted.

Snow clearing can take up to 14 - 16 hours no side streets and/or 24 - 48 hours on difficult areas after the snow stops. If snow was not cleared within the indicated timeframes, you can report the situation to 311 or my office.

In addition to City's service, here's how you can assist:

- Ensure that you clear the snow/ice from sidewalks adjacent to your property within 12 hours of a snow fall and apply salt where necessary.
- Avoid pushing snow from your private property back onto the public road when clearing snow as it is unsafe for your neighbours and drivers, and obstructs the operator's work when ploughing snow. It is illegal and a \$10,000 fine is levied against offenders.
- Avoid parking on the streets and sidewalks to enable prompt clearing of snow.
- Ensure that the fire hydrant is visible and not covered by snow in front of your property.

- Ensure that your curbside collection bins are placed properly on the boulevard next to your driveway instead of the road.
- Use public transit to avoid heavy traffic on the roads and to enable easier snow ploughing.
- Help a neighbour who's senior or disabled during the winter period to clear snow on their private property if necessary.

Frozen Pipe Prevention

The pipe in your home can freeze in cold weather and can lead to no water or cause the pipes to burst. Toronto Water encourages you to take steps to protect your pipes from freezing and learn what to do if the pipes freeze. If your pipes are prone to freezing, you may wish to contact a plumber for advice. Here are some other tips to protect your home:

- Know your Pipes: Ensure you know where the main water shut-off valve is in your home and how it operates (in case your pipes burst).
- Insulate Pipes: Wrap foam pipe insulation around pipes most at risk, especially near outside walls and in crawl spaces, the attic and garage.
- Eliminate Drafts: Seal air leaks in your home and garage to stop cold air from getting in. Check around windows and doors, electrical wiring, dryer vents and pipes.
- Drain and shut the outdoor water supply: Outdoor faucets are the first to freeze. Unscrew any hoses, turn off the outdoor water supply and let the taps drain.

When the weather drops well below zero, keep you pipes warm (keep areas that contain indoor pipes above 8C, especially near the water metre) and turn on the tap.
