PUBLIC INFORMATION SESSION ON SMARTTRACK – AUGUST 27

The City, Metrolinx and TTC have been working to develop options for SmartTrack in partnership since January 2015, when City Council approved a joint work program. SmartTrack will increase transit options for people moving around Toronto in the short term by making better use of existing transit infrastructure while we plan longer term investments in additional capacity.

SmartTrack is an enhancement on the Metrolinx RER program in the City of Toronto that includes up to six new station in Toronto on the Kitchener, Lakeshore East and Stouffville Go Corridors, and 2 new Regional Express Rail (GO RER) stations on the Barrie Go Corridor.

The purpose of the strategy is to identify actions that can be taken by the City and the community to protect, enhance and create habitat for Toronto's pollinators, such as bees and butterflies. Fun fact – Toronto is home to more than 360 species of bees, and more than 100 species of butterflies and other pollinators.

THE CANNABIS ACT

Last week, I attended a Stakeholder Roundtable on Ontario's Approach to Federal Cannabis Legalization in preparation for the July 2018 implementation by the federal government.

The federal government introduced Bill C-45 to legalize and regulate cannabis on April 13, 2017, and Bill C-46 which would create additional new offences for drug impaired driving and modernize the impaired driving regime.

This proposed federal Cannabis Act would establish the framework for cannabis, identifying permitted and prohibited activities, and providing the licensing and oversight of the legal cannabis supply chain by giving the federal Minister of Health the authority to license production, import/export and distribute, as well as recognizing provincial/territorial authority to regulate the sale of cannabis.

At the Roundtable, the conversation was surrounding responsibilities at each level of government. In the end, some of the enforcement responsibilities such as Zoning, impaired driving and so on would fall on to the City, and that is why we need to be on top of these updates from the Federal and Provincial governments, and continue to work with them on what the City's role is once this Act implemented.

SHORT-TERM RENTAL SURVEY AVAILABLE ONLINE

Municipal Licensing and Standards and City Planning divisions are inviting residents to have their say about proposed rules and regulations for short-term rentals (such as Airbnb) via an online survey at www.toronto.mlshaveyoursay. The survey is available until August 18.

There will be additional stakeholder and public consultation meetings in the fall. A final report is expected to be presented to the Executive Committee in the fourth quarter of 2017.

UPDATE ON RENTSAFETO

The RentSafeTO: Apartment Building Standard Program took effect on July 1st, 2017. It applies to all residential rental apartment buildings that are three or more storeys tall and have 10 or more apartment units. The online registration system for buildings owners if live, as of July 21, 2017.
