Happy New Year! May 2018 bring you much happiness!

We have received notice that the province will be re-mediating the section of Hwy 401 on our southern boundary. This includes expanding the highway with another lane, and may include changing the Brimley/401 interchange. TTC BUS STOP IMPROVEMENTS CONTINUES

TTC is undertaking a city-wide program to upgrade up to 2500 bus stops, with improvements to make many more stops accessible as well as accommodate articulated buses and bring the stops to a state of good repair. In some cases, new concrete pads will be constructed where none existed before.

The following TTC bus routes will receive bus stop improvements in 2018,

- 85 Sheppard East Construction scheduled to start in April
- 39 Finch East Construction scheduled to start in June

WATERMAIN FLOW METER CHAMBER UPGRADE - MCCOWAN/STEELES

The City of Toronto will be upgrading flow meters located in chambers at McCowan RD and Steeles AVE E with a planned start date of September 17, 2018. The Flow Meter Chamber Upgrade work will take approximately one to three weeks to replace each meter. For more information on the work involved, please refer to the attached Construction Notice.

TORONTO HYDRO RELIABILITY IMPROVEMENT: PROJECT MCCOWAN-MIDDLEFIELD

Toronto Hydro is planning to rebuild the aging underground electrical system to improve service reliability within the following boundaries:

• Finch AVE E to the north, Roughfield CRES to the east, Placentia BLVD to the south and Lunsfield CRES to the west.

The civil portion of the project is scheduled to commence by early January 2018 with an approximate completion date of late September 2018. There may be planned outages of which Toronto Hydro will notify you in advance. Details of the work and key map are attached.

BE PREPARED - PROTECT YOUR PIPES FROM FREEZING

Frozen pipes can leave you without water or cause your pipes to burst, leading to expensive property damage. If your pipes are prone to freezing, you may wish to contact a plumber for advice. Here are some tips to help protect your home:

- ➤ Know where to find your main water shut-off valve (in case your pipes burst).
- ➤ Insulate pipes most prone to freezing, especially near outside walls and in crawl spaces, the attic and garage.
- > Seal air leaks in areas where pipes are located. Check around windows and doors, electrical wiring, dryer vents and pipes.
- > Drain and shut the outdoor water supply as outdoor faucets are the first to freeze.
- ➤ Keep areas that contain indoor pipes above 8°C, especially near the water meter.
- In extreme cold weather, you can choose to run a pencil thin stream of water to keep water moving. However, you will be charged for the water used if you choose this step.

ONLINE REPORTING FOR NEIGHBOURHOOD TRAFFIC ISSUES/CONCERNS

As part of the modernization of the Toronto Police Service, an Online Reporting Tool was developed to allow residents to report **Neighbourhood Traffic Issues/Concerns** (speeding, disobeying stop signs, turn signs, parking, etc.) and Driving Complaints (an example would be someone cutting off, or made an illegal turn, or was on their cell phone while driving).

What you report online will go directly to 42 Division and be assigned to a traffic enforcement officer.

When reporting, access http://torontopolice.on.ca/core/, scroll down to the bottom of the page until you see the following,

Theft of Gas (From a Gas Station) FILING A FALSE POLICE REPORT IS A CRIMINAL OFFENCE If your incident meets the above criteria, please select from the available reports below: Damage to Property UNDER \$5,000 Damage to Vehicle UNDER \$5,000 Driving Complaint Fraud Under \$5,000 Theft of Gas (From a Gas Station)

You can then choose either "Local Neighbourhood Traffic Issue or Concern" or "Driving Complaint" (as circled in the image above), and the system will prompt you to enter all the relevant information.

Using an online tool not only allows you to capture information at any time, it also frees up the queue for the emergency line.
